A 700-name petition calling on council chiefs not to sell off a historic Great Barr house has been backed by a local councillor.

Friends of Redhouse Park have gathered the signatures in just one month.

and cultural centre should be explored immediately. "It a big feature of our really good park. We want to explore all options that will include community use." The grade II listed house dates back to 1845. The current tenants, British Trust for Conserva-tion Volunteers, are plan-

tion Volunteers, are planning to quit the building after years of attacks from vandals.

Sandwell Council has launched a consultation programme to look at the future of the building.
