It was explained that people are not reporting the trouble and so the Police are not treating the Park as a high priority. At the end of these Minutes are the telephone numbers to report any trouble. It was explained that even if the Police do not attend when reports are made they are noted and it builds up a picture that hopefully will give us more presence by the Police.

There is a lot of different opinion whether there is any point in locking the gates when there is so much open access to the Park, but it was decided it is worth trying, to see if it makes a difference to the gangs entering the Park particularly at night.
